



## Child Support Deductions for Payments and Arrearages 20150409

### Child Support Deductions

Deductions for child support payments and arrearages that are paid to the Department of Human Services (DHS) should have the 'Single Check Ind' field on the Debt Deduction screen marked as Y.

Since all these deductions are now going direct deposit, once payroll has processed, these payments are deposited into the DHS account; and DHS disburses them to the recipients soon after. There are several instances where an employee's payroll warrant was voided, producing credits for child support payments. These credits have been picked up on later child support remittances. In one case the credit was picked up, but that specific employee (with the credit) had no child support withheld in that payroll.

One employee's child support credit cannot be used to offset another employee's child support payment. MMRS has programmatically changed the 'Single Check Ind' on **existing** child support deductions to Y. All newly created deductions for child support payments should be entered with the 'Single Check Ind' marked as Y.
