

Transparency Mississippi –Construction Data

The Mississippi Accountability and Transparency Act of 2008 (MATA) mandates specific reporting pertaining to contracts and leases. All contracts associated with the construction process, be it the Professional, General Contractor, or other service providers can be found at: www.transparency.mississippi.gov In order to help facilitate the public's inquiries pertaining to current construction projects, users can go to the web address above and use the guidelines below as a helpful guide to find information pertaining to current construction contracts:


3. Click "Contracts"




4. Click “State of Mississippi Contracts” in the middle – Budget Year 2015 Forward



5. Change “Graphs” to “Contract Details” on the left



6. In that same list, now pick
Agency = Finance and Administration
Contract Type = Bricks Construction
Vendor = PICK YOUR VENDOR
Contract Status (you don't have to change but you can)
Service Type (you don't have to change but you can)
Category (you don't have to change but you can)



7. The project and award number are in the 6th column called “smart number”
8. Click the “Contract ID” just to the left of it
9. NOW you should see things that have been uploaded in transparency to this Contract = the contract, payments, memo, the award BP/SAF – or whatever has been uploaded.
