

Transparency Act of 2008 General FAQs

1. What is Transparency and what does MATA stand for?

"Transparency" and "MATA" are interchangeable terms referring to the Mississippi Accountability and Transparency Act of 2008 (MATA), passed by the 2008 Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature (Section 27-104-3, of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended). In response to the Transparency legislation, the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) has created a public access website to display state agency expenditures and other information beginning with Budget Year 2009.
