TIMELINE: Due with STEP TWO form

- **Site plans and specifications showing present and proposed conditions with development, including proposed new floor elevation or flood proofing elevation of each new building.**
- **Market value professional appraisal of the building (structure only, not land).**
- **Elevation certificate** of project lot/building/structure location, prior to development/construction/alteration (prepared by MS professional engineer or surveyor).**

STEP TWO continued

- **Photographs of subject property in its current condition.**
- **Detailed cost estimate (including all labor, materials, overhead, profit, etc.) of the proposed project/development.**
- **FEMA National Flood Hazard Layer FIRMette (in color) of proposed site/building.**
- **If work involves alteration of a water course, provide written description of alteration.**

TIMELINE: Due before lowest floor or, in the case of Coastal High Hazard Areas, placement of the horizontal structural member of the lowest floor.

- **A certification of elevation of the lowest floor, flood-proofed elevation, or elevation of the lowest portion of horizontal structural members of the lowest floor in relation to mean sea level (prepared by MS professional engineer or surveyor).**
- **Final complete drawings and specifications attached.**

* - **Substantial Improvement** – any repair, reconstruction, alteration, or improvements to a structure, the cost of which equals or exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the value of the structure before work is started or, if the structure was damaged, before the damage occurred.
